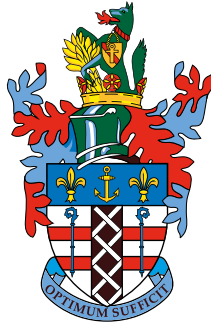

A message from the Rt. Rev. James Newcome, Bishop of Carlisle

Ulverston's War Memorial

Ulverston's War Memorial was unveiled on 11 May 1921. It was designed by W.G. Collingwood and is made of sandstone ashlar from Birchover Quarry in Derbyshire.

There are 172 names of the fallen from the First World War and 59 names of the fallen from the Second World War, inscribed on four bronze plaques.
